Project Background

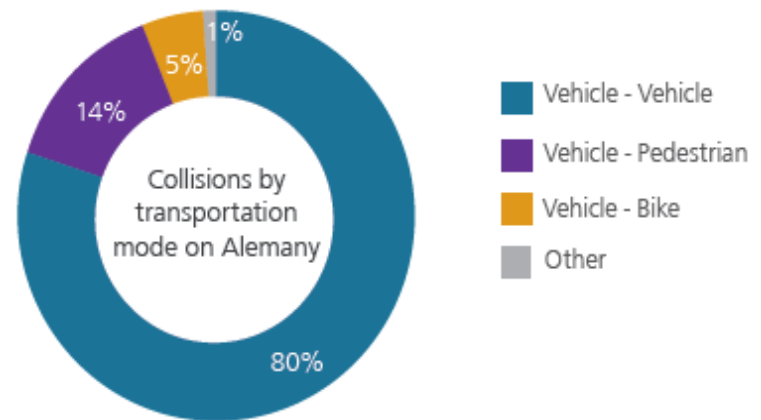
- In fall 2019, District 11 Supervisor Ahsha Safai requested \$100,000 through the SFCTA's NTIP program to conduct a planning study on the Alemany corridor



- Overall project goals:
 - Improve safety for all who travel on Alemany Boulevard
 - Reducing the number of conflicts and collisions among those who walk, bike and drive on the corridor

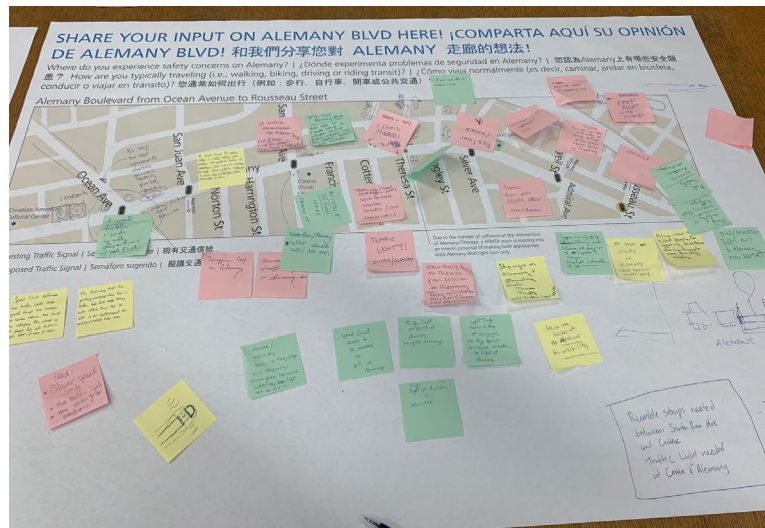
Existing Conditions

- Over a five-year period between October 2014 to September 2019, there were 145 reported injury collisions, of which one was fatal, and ten resulted in severe injuries.
- The top three intersection collision locations included:
 - Alemany at Sickles (12 collisions)
 - Alemany at Niagara* (10 collisions)
 - Alemany at Theresa (10 collisions)



*After a traffic signal was installed at Alemany/Niagara in 2018, the collisions dropped to zero.

Community Engagement



Community Feedback Received

- Concerns when using crosswalks at unsignalized and uncontrolled intersections
- Speeding and traffic enforcement
- Interest in more traffic signals at intersections that currently do not have one
- Interest in signal modifications to include protected left turns and lagging left turns
- Pedestrians safety
- Intersection visibility
- Intersection conflicts between turning vehicles and through-vehicles
- Drivers losing control and colliding with parked vehicles and homes

Safety Improvement Recommendations

- Near-Term (6 Months to 1 Year)
 - Pavement markings
 - Daylighting intersections
 - Signage
 - Pedestrian head start signals
- Mid-Term (1 Year to 3 Years)
 - Speed radar signs
 - Upgrading signal lens to larger size
 - Signal timing
- Long-Term (3+ Years)
 - New traffic signals
 - Left-turn signal treatments

Next Steps

- Begin field work and installation of near-term improvements
- Work with Supervisor Safai's office, SFCTA and SFMTA to determine funding strategy for mid and long-term recommendations
