#### State Transit Assistance (STA) County Block Grant Overview



- ► Metropolitan Transportation Commission established County Block Grant program to be administered by Congestion Management Agencies (CMAs)
  - ▶ Previously, funds distributed via regional paratransit program, regional Lifeline Transportation Program, and northern counties/small transit operators program
  - New Block Grant allows counties to determine how to invest in paratransit, transit operating and capital needs, including providing lifeline transit services
- CMAs submit annual distribution policy to MTC

### San Francisco's STA County Block Grant Proposed Framework



- Projected \$7.6 million over FY 2018/19 and FY 2019/20
  - ► County share based on amount San Francisco would have received in FY 2018/19 under former regional programs
- Recommended distribution
  - ► 40% to the SFMTA's paratransit program
  - ► 60% to new SF Lifeline Transportation Program (SF LTP)

    Cycle 1, administered by the Transportation Authority

### SF LTP Cycle 1 Eligibility



- Must be eligible per STA guidelines established by state
- Support projects that improve mobility for low-income residents
- Only transit operators are eligible to receive STA funds
- ► 10% local match requirement
- Project examples include

► New, enhanced, or restored transit service, including late-night and

weekend services

**►** Transit stop enhancements

**►** Shuttle service



#### SF LTP Cycle 1 Prioritization Criteria



#### Once projects are screened for eligibility...

- Highest priority to transit service benefiting Communities of Concern
- Priority given to project that
  - ▶ Directly address transportation gaps and/or barriers identified through a planning effort involving focused inclusive engagement to low-income populations
  - ► Ready to be implemented
  - **▶** Cost-effective
  - ▶ Higher local match
- Geographic diversity
