2014 Prop K Strategic Plan and 5YPPs NTIP

- Response to public and Board input: focus on neighborhoods, equity
 - Communities of Concern and other underserved neighborhoods

Planning

\$100K in Prop K funds for planning projects in each supervisorial district during next five years

Capital

Prop K funds to leverage other funds for two neighborhood scale (small- to mid-size) projects in each supervisorial district during next five years

- Prop K helps offset San Francisco's local match contribution to Caltrain's capital budget
- Capital contribution negotiated among member agencies each year (San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara)
- Project lists include placeholders vs. named projects
- Proposed funding matches Santa Clara VTA Short Range Transit Plan

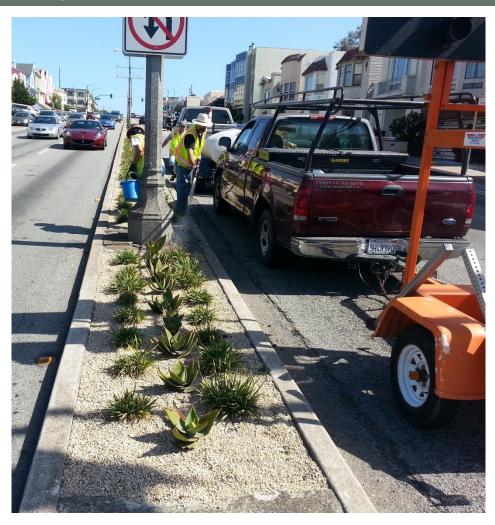

- Two signal modification contracts \$3.96M Prop K, \$6.6M Total
- 3rd St video detection replacement \$1.05M
 Prop K, \$1.6M Total
- Supports NTIP, including Eddy/Ellis
- ▶ 74% more Prop K programmed (\$23M) than in 2009 5YPP







Traffic Calming Done and Underway Projects

Traffic Calming Highlights

- Local application-based and School tracks - well defined and planning underway
- Further development needed for Proactive residential, Arterial tracks
- ► 15% more Prop K programmed (\$14.3M) than 2009 5YPP
 - Over past 5 years, \$12.4M available, \$7.5M allocated
 - Significant unspent balances
- Supports Vision Zero, NTIP, and follow-the-paving
