# Gangway and Piers - State of Good Repair (GGBHTD) – Construction





- Prop K request: \$150,000
- Leverages FTA and GGBHTD funds
- Replace hydraulic ramps, repair floats at SF Ferry Terminal
- Extend service life of docking/boarding facilities until reconstruction in 2024
- ► Open for use by June 2020

# 45th and Lincoln Intersection Improvements [NTIP Capital] (SFMTA) – Construction







- Prop K request: \$100,000
- ► 45<sup>th</sup> and Lincoln Improvement project
  - ► Convert painted safety zone into concrete bulbout
  - ► Construct 3 curb ramps (NW, NE, and SE corners)
  - ► Relocate 1 catch basin
  - Install continental crosswalk on east leg
- ► Open for use by March 2019

# YBI Hillcrest Road/Treasure Island Road Bike Path (SFCTA, SFMTA) - Planning





- Prop K request: \$250,000
- Prepare Project Concept Plan
- ► New bike/ped facility from Bay Bridge East Span to new T.I. Ferry Terminal
- Enables project to proceed to environmental review and approval
- ▶ Plan done by Fall 2019

# BART Station Bicycle Parking and Access Improvements (BART) - Construction







- Prop K request: \$550,000
- ► Improve bicycle parking and access at 4 BART stations:
  - ▶ 10 Bikeep racks at 16<sup>th</sup> St.
  - ▶ 20 Bikeep racks at 24<sup>th</sup> St.
  - ► Bike stair channels at 24<sup>th</sup>, Civic Center, Embarcadero
  - ► Remodel bike stations at Embarcadero and Civic Center
- ▶ Open for use by March 2020

# Bicycle Safety Education and Outreach (SFMTA) – Construction





- ► Prop K request: \$90,529
- ► Education: 40+ classes for adults and youth
- Outreach: participation at festivals, markets, and open streets
  - encourage bicycling, bike safety
- ► January-December 2019

#### Youth Bicycle Safety Education (SFMTA)

Construction





- ► Prop K request: \$90,000
- Two-week in-school classes
  - ► 6 middle and high schools
  - ▶ 3 elementary schools
  - ►~640 students in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, and 9<sup>th</sup> grade
- Program evaluation
- January June 2019

#### What is ConnectSF?

**ConnectSF** is a multi-agency partnership to build an effective, equitable, and sustainable transportation system for San Francisco's future.











#### The 3 Phases of ConnectSF

- Phase 1: "What is the future of San Francisco as a place to live, work, and play in the next 30 and 50 years?"
- Phase 2: "What do we need to get to our vision for the future? What are the implications for land use and transportation?"
- Phase 3: Funding, Building and codifying the plans

### **Transportation Needs Assessment**

#### What are those needs? Where are those needs?

- Metrics by Vision Goals
- Transportation Performance (today vs. 2050)
- Analysis of metrics for each goal area
- Identify gaps in systemwide performance
- Complete by November 2018

## **Transportation Network Development**

#### What mode(s) is (are) needed to achieve those needs?

- Metrics' used in corridor evaluation
- Identify corridors with gaps in system and/or metric performance
- Complete by December 2018



## **Transit Corridors Study**

- Led by SFMTA
- Prop K request: \$420,000
- Develop next generation of transit projects
  - Explore transit corridor alignments and project concepts
  - Develop project descriptions and benefits
  - Assess storage and maintenance needs
  - Provide preliminary cost estimations
  - Prioritize projects
- Final report by July 2020



### 22<sup>nd</sup> St. Station Study

- Led by SF Planning
- Prop K request: \$160,000
- Serves the Pennsylvania Alignment:
  - Analyze and make recommendations for rebuilding or developing a new station at a preferred location




- Coordinate with Transit Corridors and Streets & Freeways studies
- Conceptual station designs
- Cost estimates/Implementation Plan
- Final report by October 2020



### **Streets and Freeways Study**

- Led by SFCTA
- Prop K request: \$150,000
- Develop next generation of major street and freeway related projects
  - Freeway Improvements
  - Managed Lanes
  - Pricing
  - Goods Movement and Urban Deliveries
  - Citywide Street Mission Statements
- Final report by December 2019


