## Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects | Advancing Caltrain and High-Speed Rail

#### **Downtown Extension Peer Review**

- Peer Review Panel final findings presented in October
- 2-year work program, interagency agreements, DTX design advancing; appropriated PAX scoping funds

#### **Caltrain Business Plan**

• Long-Range Service Vision adopted by Caltrain Board in October; supporting 1/8 sales tax discussion

## California High-Speed Rail

- Supported TJPA in obtaining Federal environmental approval (record of decision)
- Preferred alternative for the draft environmental clearance document approved in September

## Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects | Treasure Island Transportation Program

#### Treasure Island Mobility Management Agency

- Toll Policy/Outreach adopted exemption policy for existing residents; engaging workers, employers, and future residents
- YBI bike/ped path and electric ferry plans
- Autonomous shuttle concept of operations

## exemption gaging residents ferry plans

#### Yerba Buena Island Improvement Project

- Advertised Southgate Road Realignment construction phase work in December 2019
- Issued 90% design plans for West Side Bridges Retrofit







## **Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects |** Freeway Studies

#### US101/I280 Express Lanes and Bus Project:

- In coordination with San Mateo prepared a Project Initiation Document (approved)
- Awarded \$4.1 million in Prop K funds to start environmental studies, including an equity study
- Participated in 101 corridor coordination with Caltrans and regional agencies



## Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects | Freeway Studies

#### D9 Freeway Program:

- Alemany Bike/Ped Safety Improvements
  - SFMTA and SF Public Works (SFPW) completed design of bicycle lanes, initiated design of multi-use path and signalized crossing
- Alemany Realignment Study
  - Developed concept and coordinated with Caltrans on designs
- US 101/Alemany Deck Replacement
  - Coordinated with Caltrans, Districts 9 and 10 offices, SFMTA, SFPW and others on traffic and transit mitigation measures for planned reconstruction in July 2020

#### Downtown Congestion Pricing Study

- Launched Congestion Pricing Study
- Convened Policy Advisory Committee
- Conducted stakeholder interviews, public survey
- Existing conditions and Equity Study underway
- Testified before House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee

## **Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects |** TNC Congestion Mitigation Tax and CMP

#### Traffic Congestion Mitigation Tax

- San Francisco voters approved a per-trip fee on Transportation Network Company trips in November
- Anticipated to generate \$30M for transit service and street safety improvements



#### Congestion Management Program (CMP)

- Adopted 2019 Congestion Management Program Report
- Published updated interactive congestion map and new bike/pedestrian collisions map
- Supported Muni Reliability Working Group

## **Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects** | Vision Zero



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#### SOMA Ramp Intersections Safety Study:

- Recommended safety improvements at 10 South of Market intersections
- Held robust public engagement efforts
- Allocated D6 NTIP funds to support implementation



#### Vision Zero:

- Vision Zero Committee
- Vision Zero Quick Build Program (\$5M in Prop K)
- Lombard Street Vision Zero Project (support)

## Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects | Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects



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#### **Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects - Prop K**

- Valencia Street protected bicycle lanes and pilot
- Battery and Sansome Bicycle Connections
- BART 16<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> St. station bike parking
- Better Market Street raised cycle track pilot

#### Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects - Prop AA and TFCA

- Golden Gate Transit 67 bus racks
- Citywide bicycle wayfinding signs
- US 101/Cesar Chavez/Potrero bikeway

#### **Investing in San Francisco's Transportation Future |** Streets and Traffic Safety, and Transportation System Management



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#### **Curb Ramps / Signals and Signs**

- Nearly 300 new curb ramps constructed
- New signals at 35 intersections on 19<sup>th</sup> Ave., Arguello Blvd., California St., Second St.
- 100 pedestrian countdown signals, 32 audible pedestrian signals, 4 Rapid Flashing Beacons

#### Street Reconstruction - completed and substantially complete

- Filbert and Leavenworth (25 blocks) (Prop K)
- Brannan (21 blocks) (Prop AA)
- Ingalls and Industrial Streets (31 blocks)
- Parkmerced, Twin Peaks, and Mt Davidson Manor neighborhoods (43 blocks)
- Clayton Street, Clipper Street, and Portola Drive (24 blocks) <sup>12</sup>

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Planning and Delivering Transportation Projects | Lombard Crooked Street

Lombard Crooked Street Reservation and Pricing System Study

- Study recommended:
  - Paid reservations system
  - Improved enforcement
  - Tourist industry engagement
  - Enhanced engineering and signage
- Assembly bill 1605 (Ting) passed to authorize the program, but vetoed by Governor
- Continuing to work with the Governor office, Assemblymember Ting, and D2 Supervisor to identify solutions

#### ConnectSF and the San Francisco Transportation Plan:

- Statement of Needs (done)
- Transit Corridors Study (started)
- Streets and Freeway Study (started)



 Coordinated SF input, facilitated public discussions (e.g. FASTER, Voices for Public Transportation, Seamless)








### Investing in San Francisco's Transportation Future | Prop K Sales Tax Revenues



- Allocated over \$97M in Prop K in 2019
- Inception to date, we've allocated over \$1.8 B
- On average, each sales tax dollar leverages more than \$4 in other funds




#### Investing in San Francisco's Transportation Future | Muni Fleet - Rehabilitation, Replacement and Expansion



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
• Prop K funds are helping SFMTA fully replace its bus and light rail fleets



#### Investing in San Francisco's Transportation Future | Muni Guideways Projects

#### Key Reliability and Operations Projects Delivered

- Radio Replacement Project (\$51.7M in Prop K)
  - Enables direct communications of operators with Transportation Management Center
- Integrated Systems Development Project
  - Provides communications, monitoring and control in Muni Metro Subway (\$15.5M in Prop K)
- 19<sup>th</sup> Ave./Rossmoor track and signal replacement
- 33 Stanyan overhead wire, traffic signal improvements



- Radio Replacement
- Central Control and Communications
