SB1 Local Partnership Program **Overview**

- Reward jurisdictions with voterapproved taxes, tolls, and fees dedicated to transportation
- Administered by California Transportation Commission (CTC)
- 60% Formulaic Program, 40%
 Competitive Program (statewide)
- SFCTA is eligible for both Formula and Competitive funds
- Competitive call to distribute
 \$187 million (FYs 2020/21 2022/23)



SB1 Local Partnership Program Requirements

- Construction only
- Dollar-for-dollar match
- Full funding plan
- Minimum grant size \$3 million
- Nominations submitted in priority order



SB1 Local Partnership Program Evaluation Criteria

Higher priority to projects that:

- Are more cost-effective
- Can commence construction sooner
- Leverage more committed funds per LPP dollar
- Demonstrate air quality improvements, vehicle-miles traveled reductions
- Demonstrate regional and community support
- Improve safety and current system conditions

- Mission Geneva to Trumbull
- Geneva Mission to Prague

Priority #2 Mission Bay Ferry Landing (SF Port)





Single-float, two-berth ferry landing for regional ferry service to Mission Bay area and surrounding neighborhood

Environmentally cleared

Design complete

Reduces vehicle trips and relieves stress on the Transbay Corridor

Overmatch to LPP

Next Steps

Coordinating project nominations with CCSF per CTC guidelines

June 22, 2020: Project applications due to CTC

November 12, 2020: CTC releases staff recommendations

December 2, 2020: CTC adopts program of projects
