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## **Prop K Sales Tax - BART**

This fact sheet provides some highlights of BART-eligible programs in the Prop K half-cent transportation sales tax Expenditure Plan. This is the current sales tax program that is in effect, approved by San Francisco voters in 2003.

- Voters first approved San Francisco's half-cent sales tax for transportation in 1989 as Prop B. The Prop B Expenditure Plan did not include any funding for BART or Caltrain.
- BART was added as an eligible sponsor to the Prop K Expenditure Plan in 2003. Programs that are dedicated to improving BART total about \$40 million in 2003 dollars (see table 1). BART can also compete for funding from a number of other Prop K programs (see table 2).
- Some of the projects that Prop K funding has helped fund include:
  - 24th Street/Mission BART Plaza and Pedestrian Improvements
  - Balboa Park Station Eastside Connections and Westside Entrance and Walkway
  - Civic Center BART/Muni Bike Station
  - Embarcadero Station: New Northside Platform Elevator
  - Powell Street Station Modernization
  - o Replacement of Platform Edge Tiles, Stair Treads
