Dear Chair Mandelman and SFCTA Board,

We are long time members of the Sherman Elementary School community writing to add our voices to the growing chorus demanding this body take immediate action to ensure pedestrian safety around Sherman Elementary School.

The dangers posed to pedestrians walking in the area around Sherman have long been manifest. And indeed this danger was apparently brought to the attention of City officials by members of our community many times over the past several years. Regrettably, both our community's warnings about these dangers and our efforts to have them ameliorated went unheeded.

On November 10th Andrew Zieman, a beloved member of our Sherman community, was senselessly slaughtered by a motorist while he was on the SIDEWALK in front of the school. Both the occurrence and the aftermath were witnessed by members of our community, including young children. Andrew was only 30 years old. He was killed while on his way to work with kids who loved him and depended upon him.

The harm caused to our community by the events of November 10th will take years to heal. And the grief, scars and pain will never completely go away. Andrew, and what he meant to our children and our community, can never be replaced. The opportunity to possibly prevent his death was squandered by the failure to act to ameliorate these dangerous conditions before the tragic events of November 10th. Sadly it's now too late to do anything to bring Andrew back.

Today this Board has a unique opportunity. It's not yet too late to take actions to prevent this from ever happening again. And we now all have a graphic and horrible reminder of the costs of failing to act. Providing these types of basic safety measures, while perhaps to some a seemingly unglamorous part of the job, are the essential and core functions of a responsive and responsible local government. You have the power to prevent future harm and possibly save lives. Please use that power fully and immediately, today.

We ask that you move now with all deliberate speed to take all the actions necessary to prevent this kind of tragedy from ever occurring again.
