






Funding and Programming Activities in 2021



- Allocated \$94.4 million in Prop K sales tax in 2021
- Administered \$437.6 million in open Prop K grants
- Approved 2021 Prop K Strategic Plan Update

Funding Accomplishments in 2021, Look Ahead in 2022



Funding Obtained/Programmed in 2021

- Helped SFMTA and Comm. Ronen in securing \$30M 'hardship funds' from MTC for Muni service
- Received \$18 million RAISE federal discretionary grant, for the YBI West-Side Bridges
- Secured \$12M DTX design funding from MOU agencies and supported \$30M local financing
- Secured \$6M in regional funding for YBI Multi Use Path environmental review and West Side Bridges capital construction

 Programmed up to \$3M in STA Block Grant (Lifeline) funds to SFMTA's paratransit program

Caltrain Downtown Rail Extension

- ED Chaired Executive Steering Committee and guided completion of phasing and operational studies
- Secured Funding commitments from MOU partners for design phase

- Leading Funding, Project Delivery and Governance efforts


CA High Speed Rail

Vision Zero Activities

- Funded 45 projects with nearly \$44 million for new and upgraded traffic signals, traffic calming, and other pedestrian, bicycle, and street safety improvements
- Includes support for quick-build projects on the High Injury Network (over \$5.8 million in Prop K and TNC Tax funds) and the SFMTA's Slow Streets Program to ensure space for safe, socially distanced walking and biking
- Held 3 Vision Zero hearings on Vision Zero Action Strategy and other topics at Transportation Authority Board

Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects







Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects - Prop K

- Completed new bike lanes on Anza, Howard and through the Alemany interchange
- Completed study of bike facility around Lake Merced
- Completed bicycle and pedestrian path at the Bayshore/ Cesar Chavez/ Potrero intersection
- Completed design for new multi-use path connecting Alemany Farmers Market to San Bruno Avenue
- Bike to Anywhere Day
- Youth and adult bicycle education classes
- Bicycle facility maintenance
- On-street bike racks citywide (TFCA)
- Completed bike cage at SFSU campus (TFCA)

Streets and Traffic Safety, and Transportation System Management





Street Reconstruction - completed and substantial progress

- Completed construction on the Haight Street Resurfacing and Pedestrian Lighting project (10 blocks) (Prop K + Prop AA)
- Geary Blvd. (28 blocks) (Prop AA)
- Significant progress on the 23rd St, Dolores Street, York Street, and Hampshire Street pavement renovation project (39 blocks)

Curb Ramps / Signals and Signs

- Nearly 50 new curb ramps constructed
- 271 pedestrian countdown signals, 212 audible pedestrian signals
- Upgraded and activated traffic signals at 34 intersections

Traffic Calming

 126 traffic calming measures, including 72 speed humps and 51 speed cushions

Traffic Congestion Mitigation/TNC Tax (Prop D)

 Allocated \$3 million in TNC Tax collections to the SFMTA's Vision Zero Quick-Build Program

Autonomous Vehicles (AV) Rulemaking

- With SMTA, provided input on regulations proposed by CPUC addressing driverless Autonomous Vehicle services (passenger and goods movement)
- Focused on supporting safe, accountable equitable deployment, e.g., successfully advocated for disability access goal and inclusion of equity

Capital Financing and Investment Program

- All \$248 million of bond proceeds spent timely by May 2021
- Secured \$125 million, 3-year revolving credit agreement with lower interest rates in Oct 2021
