SB1 Local Partnership Program **Overview** 

- Reward jurisdictions with voter-approved taxes, tolls, and fees dedicated to transportation
- Administered by California Transportation Commission (CTC)
- 60% Formulaic Program, 40% Competitive Program (statewide)
- SFCTA is eligible for both Formula and Competitive funds
- Competitive call to distribute \$144 million (FYs 2023/24 – 2024/25)

SB1 Local Partnership Program **Requirements** 

- LPP can only fund construction
- Dollar-for-dollar match
- Full funding plan
- Maximum grant size \$25 million
- Nominations submitted in priority order



SB1 Local Partnership Program Evaluation Criteria



## Higher priority to projects that:

- Are more cost-effective
- Can commence construction sooner
- Leverage more committed funds per LPP dollar
- Demonstrate air quality improvements, vehicle-miles traveled reductions
- Demonstrate regional and community support
- Improve safety and current system preservation

### Priority #1 Next Generation Fare Gates (BART)





Request: \$5.4 million

Total Cost: \$10.8 million

**Replace 86 existing faregates** 

**Embarcadero, Montgomery Street, and Glen Park Stations** 

#### New swing-style faregates

- Existing gates at end of useful life
- New gates will improve reliability, accessibility

Construction is expected to start in 2023 and be completed by the end of 2026

### **Priority #2 Transbay Howard Streetscape** (SFPW)




Request: \$12.9 million

Total Cost: \$53.5 million

Howard Street between The Embarcadero and 4th Street

Bulbouts, curb ramps, new 2-way cycle track and traffic signal modifications and new bike signals

Construction would start by the end of 2023 and the project would be open for use by the end of 2025
