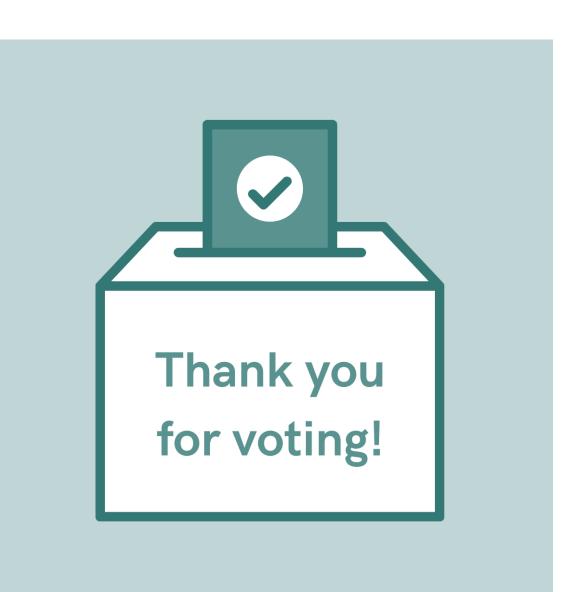

Proposition L

Approved by 71.8% of San Francisco voters

- Extends the ½ cent local transportation sales tax through 2053
- Establishes a new 30-year Expenditure Plan superseding Proposition K
- Effective date: April 1, 2023





Proposition L Expenditure Plan

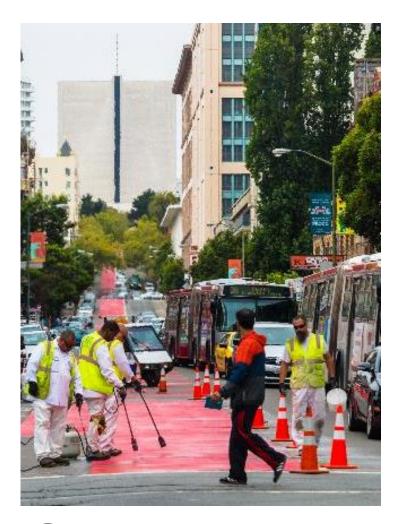

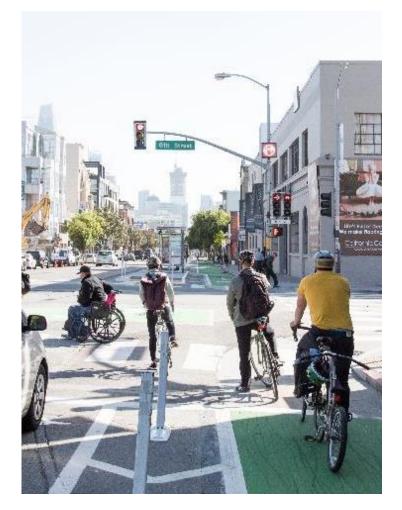

Prop L Expenditure Plan

- Determines eligibility of projects and sponsor agencies through 28 programs
- Sets funding caps for each program over 30 years
- Allows for financing to accelerate project delivery
- Includes requirements such as a Boardapproved Strategic Plan and Boardapproved 5-Year Prioritization Programs (5YPPs), as a prerequisite for allocation

2022 Transportation Expenditure Plan will help deliver safer, smoother streets, more reliable transit, reduce congestion, and more.



Strategic Plan

Why is the Strategic Plan important?

- Guides day-to-day administration of the sales tax program
- Serves as a financial planning tool for implementing the 30-year measure
- Supports transparency and accountability in how sales tax funds are used

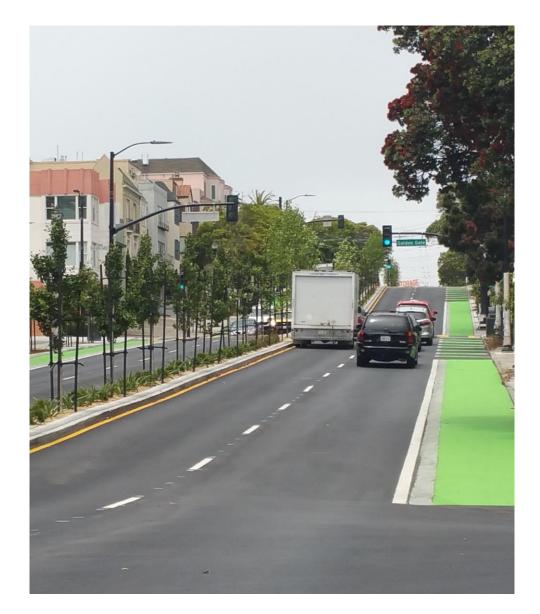




Strategic Plan

What is in the Strategic Plan?

- Establishes policies for Prop L administration
- Forecasts sales tax revenues over 30 years
- Forecasts expenditures by fiscal year
 - Assigns programming and cash flow by program by fiscal year
 - Estimates financing needs, including estimated debt needs and actual debt issued





5-Year Prioritization Programs (5YPPs)

Why are the 5YPPs important?

- Provides transparency for how projects are prioritized
- Provides an opportunity for public and Board input early in the project development process
- Opportunity to strategize on leveraging and funding strategy
- Identify early opportunities for inter-agency project coordination





5-Year Prioritization Programs (5YPPs)

What is in the 5YPPs?

- Prioritization criteria to guide project selection
- 5-year lists of projects for every program in the Expenditure Plan (28 total)
- Performance measures for evaluation, to help inform subsequent 5YPP development
- Other required elements (e.g., funding plans)





5-Year Prioritization Programs (5YPPs)

Required Prioritization Criteria:

- Relative level of need or urgency
- Cost-effectiveness
- A fair geographic distribution
- Level and diversity of community support, including from disadvantaged populations*
- Benefit to disadvantaged populations, including communities historically harmed by displacement, transportation policies, and projects that utilized eminent domain*

*New/revised by the Expenditure Plan Advisory Committee

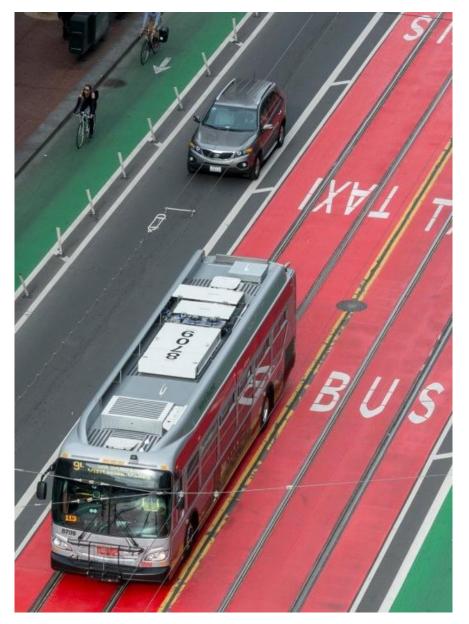


5-Year Prioritization Programs (5YPPs)

We can and expect to propose additional criteria, e.g.:

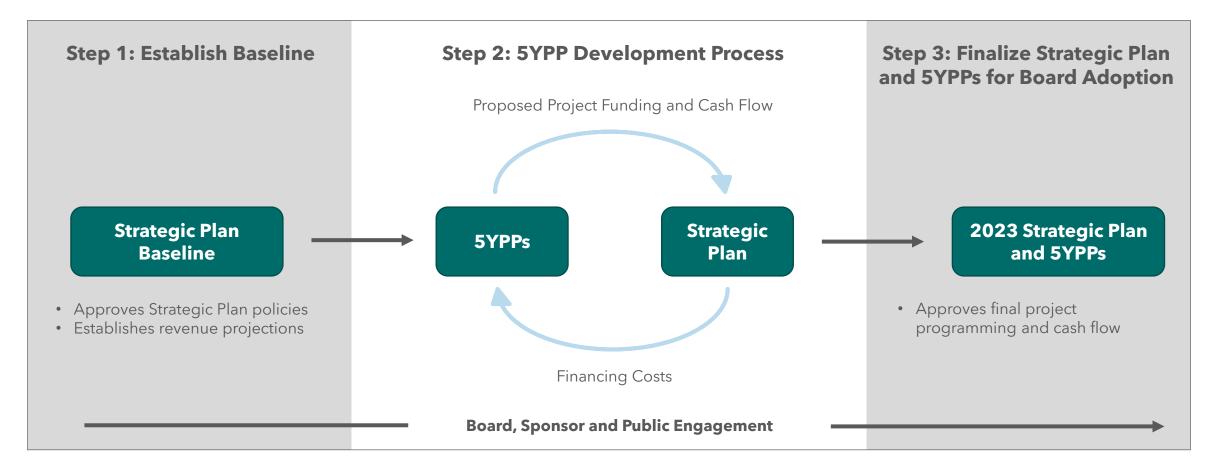
- Safety
- Leveraging

Criteria may be applied across all programs or can be program specific.

Strategic Plan / 5YPPs Development

May recommend advancing funds in the Strategic Plan Baseline for:

- Caltrain Downtown Rail Extension - \$300 million
- BART Core Capacity program (vehicle procurement) - \$100 million

(amounts in 2020 dollars)







Outreach Approach

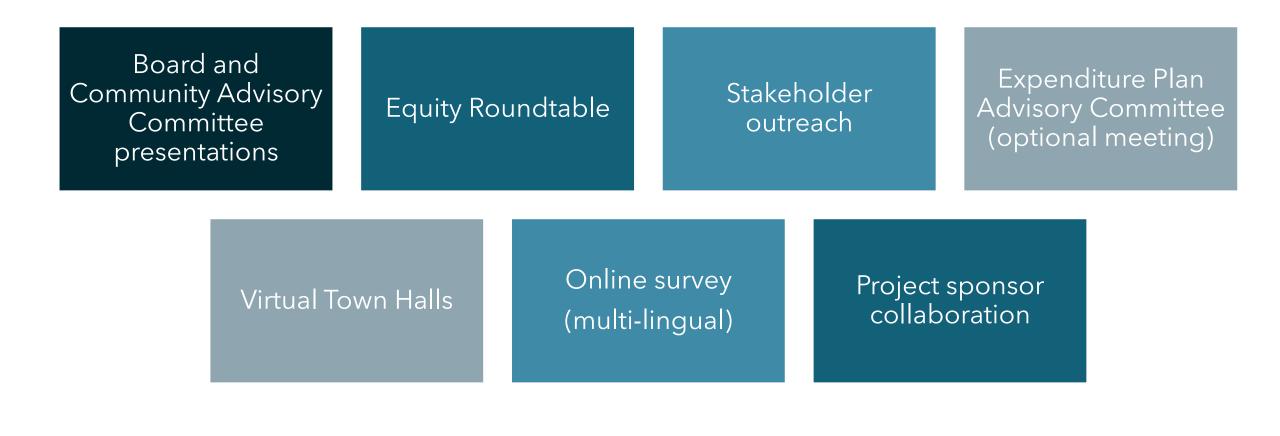
To ensure an inclusive planning process for the development of the Strategic Plan and 5YPPs

- Ongoing throughout this process
- Builds on prior outreach from the Expenditure Plan process and other initiatives (e.g., community-based planning studies)
- Target input from Equity Priority Communities and disadvantaged communities
- Opportunity to weigh in on projects
- Help understand what equity means for different programs (e.g., Safer and Complete Streets, Transit Enhancements, etc.)



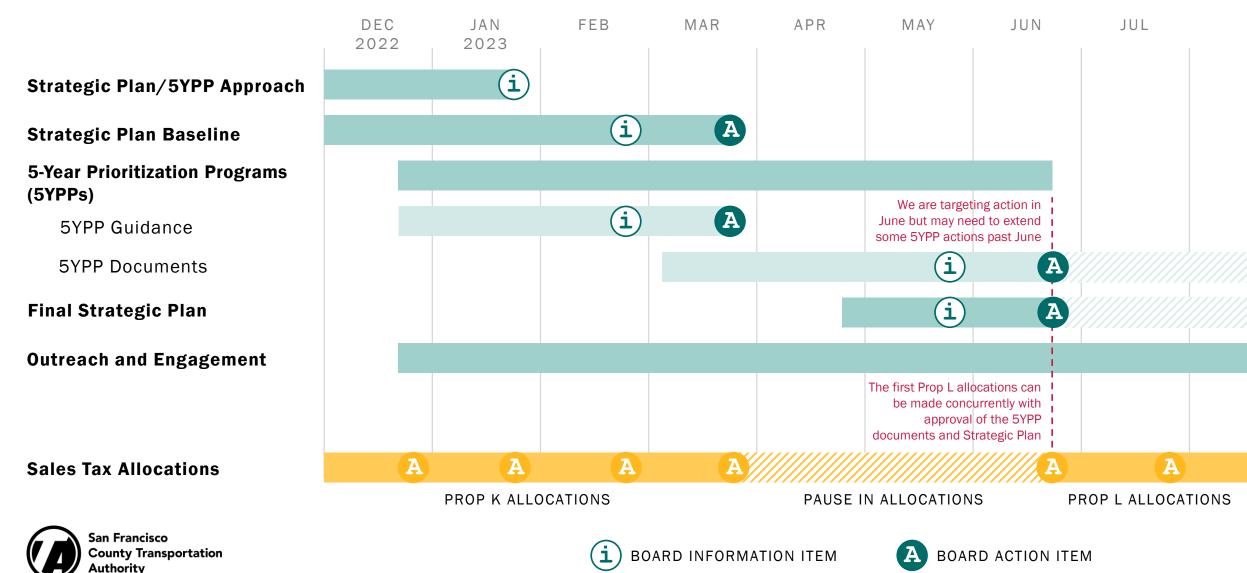
