Active Communities Plan

The plan is inclusive of skateboards as a mode that can legally use bike network facilities.

SFMTA's Active Communities Plan

- The Active Communities Plan will create the first plan for rolling and bicycling since 2009. The plan is funded through a Caltrans Planning Grant with Prop K/L sales tax local match and will include:
 - A 10-15 year investment plan
 - An expanded active transportation network
 - Parking and facilities recommendations
 - New supportive programs and policies

San Francisco Transportation Code


- SEC. 7.2.13. NON-MOTORIZED USER-PROPELLED VEHICLES (NUV). This code section covers skateboards.
- Skateboards are allowed to use bike network facilities.
- Sidewalks: Skateboards are not allowed on sidewalks in any business district and not on any sidewalk in the city from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise
- Roadways: prohibited in any street in any business district, they must yield the right-of-way to pedestrians on foot, and can not travel against traffic

UN Plaza Skate Park

Opened November 8th

- Includes concrete skate elements, along with chess, ping pong, teqball, foosball, and fitness court
- Designed by eight-member advocacy board made up of skate company and shop owners, professional and non-professional skaters
- \$2 million, 13,000 sq foot
- 2-year pilot to activate the space





Skateboard Infrastructure Funding

Preliminary Information

- RPD: No dedicated funding, allocated on a caseby-case basis.
 - UN Plaza Skate Park was financed with \$2M from the RPD general fund.
- SFMTA: No skateboard specific fund sources, but skateboards can use bike facilities and SFMTA has access to a wide variety of local, regional, state, and federal sources for this purpose.



Street Closures for Special Events

Application Process

- Step 1: Apply for the appropriate permit; Special Event Street Closure vs. Neighborhood Block Party
- Step 2: Applications are reviewed by SFMTA staff and are then considered by the Interdepartmental Staff Committee on Traffic and Transportation (ISCOTT) at a public hearing The deadline to submit an application is 30 days prior to the event but 4 to 6 months is recommended
- Fees: \$1,200 if submitted 120+ before event, \$1,500 if 90-120 days. \$1,800 if 60-89 days, \$2,200 if 30-59 days
