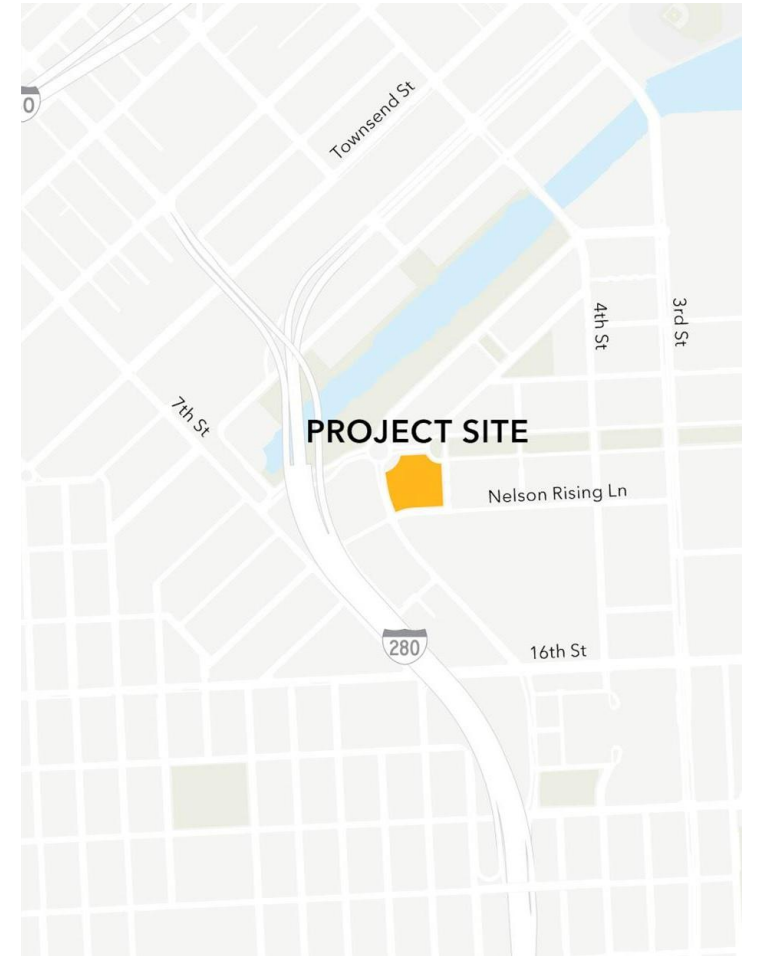
Mission Bay School Access – Scope

 - Feasible Recommendations

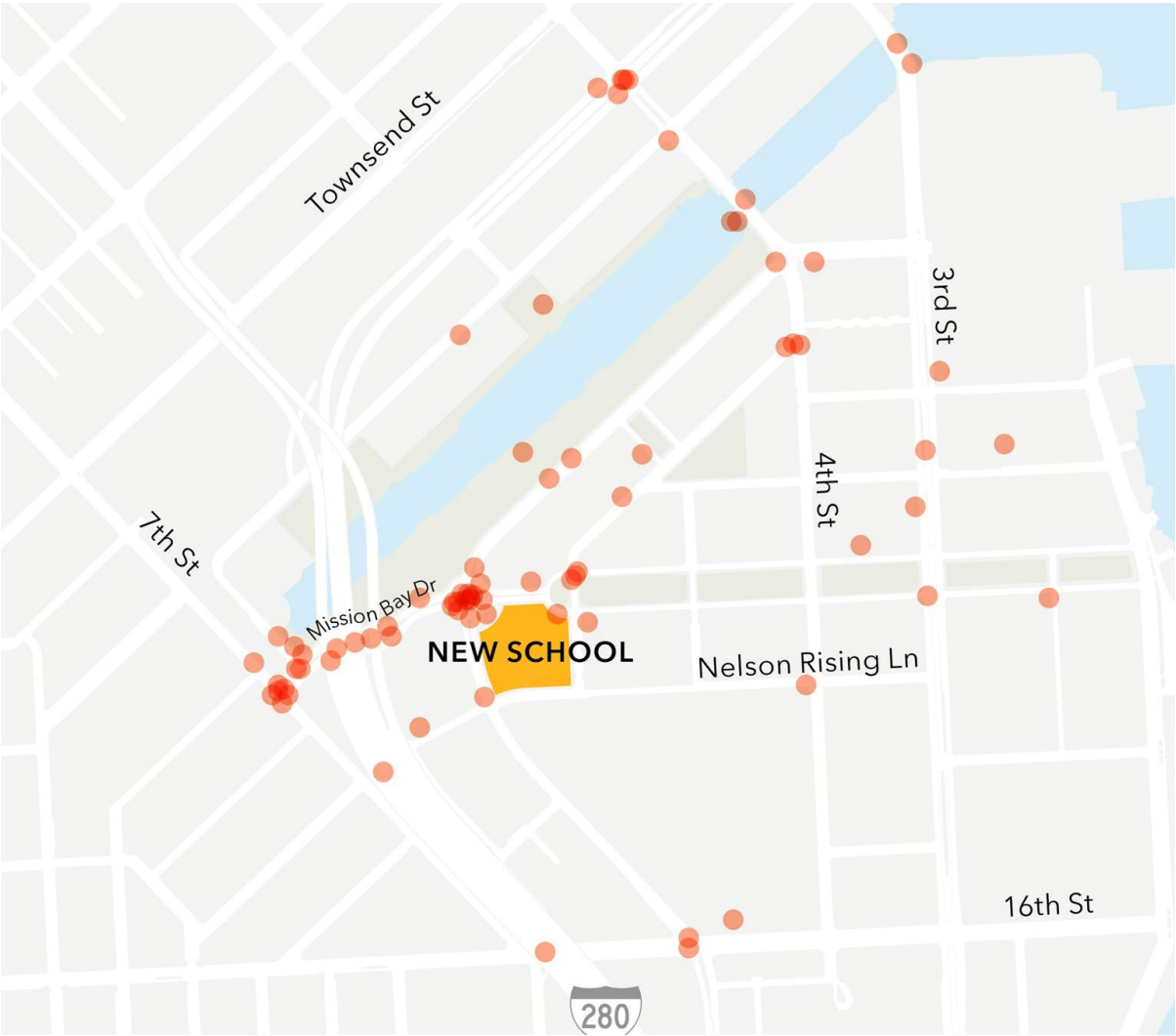
Core Scope

- Identify “Key Barriers” and design solutions
- Identify road segments which need improvements to connect the school site to SF’s Broader active network

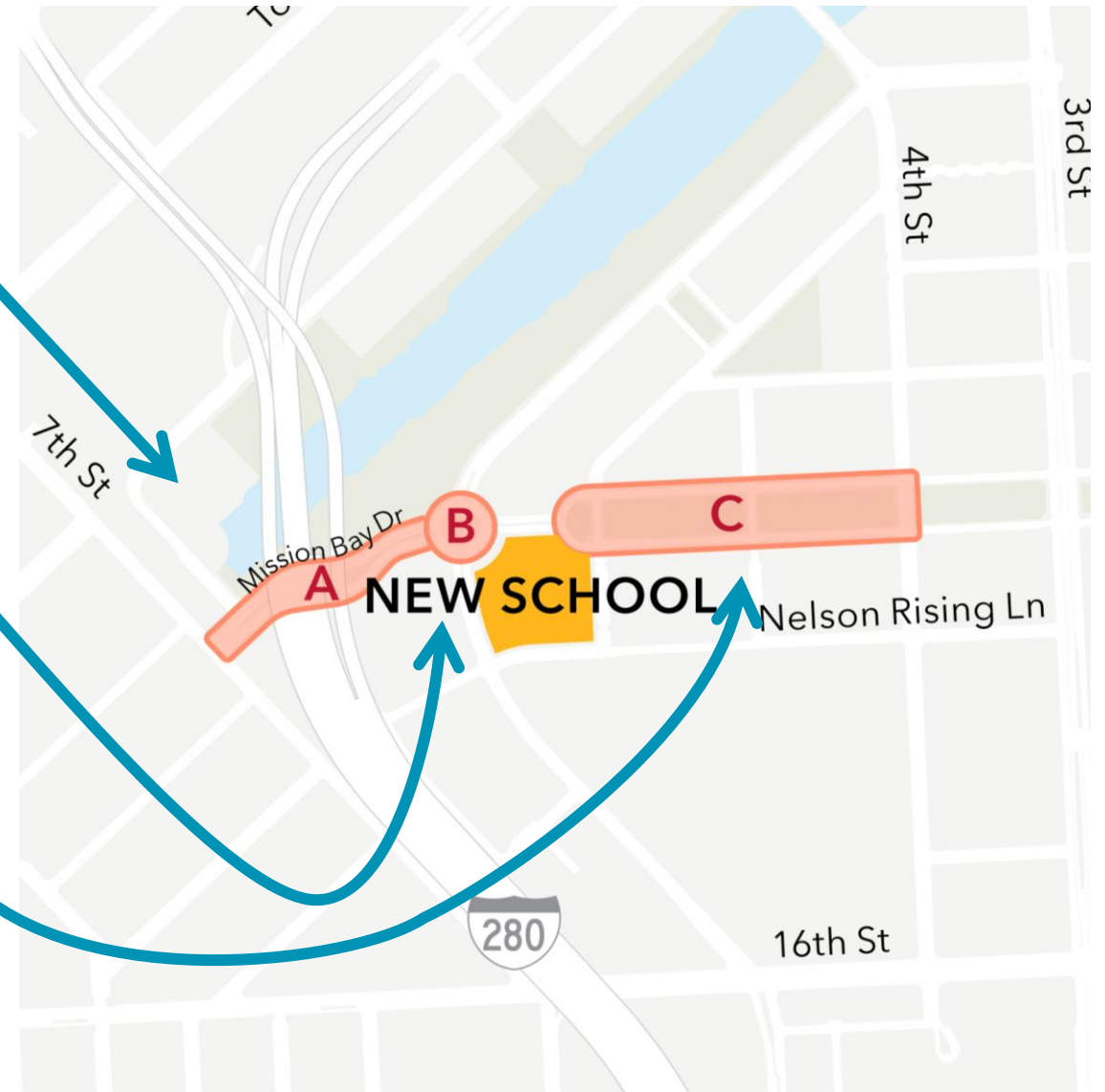
Left turn improvements for cyclists

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Next Steps

Next Steps for Mission Bay School Access Plan

- Release \$30,000 of project funds held on reserve for additional conceptual design and outreach (action today)
- Design and evaluate up to two new roundabout concepts
- Town hall and meetings with community-based organizations for feedback on revised design concepts (January 2026)
- Final report and recommendations to SFCTA Board (April 2026)

Other Next Steps

- SFMTA launch detailed design of Mission Bay Boulevard North/South Traffic Calming, including public outreach
- SFMTA completes construction of Mission Bay Boulevard North/South Traffic Calming (Summer 2026)

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(SFMTA and SFCTA) Planning

Prop K Amendment: Release \$30,000 on reserve

Total Cost: \$319,307 (unchanged)

- Original grant reserved \$90,000 to implement recommendations in the final plan
- Request to release \$20,000 to SFCTA and \$10,000 to SFMTA to analyze two potential modifications to the draft roundabout recommendation including additional community outreach
- Modifications will be evaluated, and findings will be incorporated into the final report for the Mission Bay School Access Plan
- Final plan, including additional efforts, expected to be presented to the Board for adoption in April 2026
