Project overview

Project Goal

 Improve safety and access to places that attract vulnerable road users such as children, seniors, and people with disabilities in District 2

Outcomes

- Recommend context-specific safety improvements
- Design and implementation of selected quick-build improvements



What We Heard (summer 2024)

- Speeding, distracted driving, and lack of traffic enforcement are major issues across study areas
- Community input to guide development of quick-build recommendations at 6 locations across the district

What is quick-build?


Reversible, adjustable traffic safety improvements that can be installed relatively quickly. Examples include high visibility crosswalks, painted safety zones, traffic calming, and parking and loading adjustments.



Marina: Pedestrian and Cyclist Safety

We heard: Drivers frequently violate the "no right on red" restriction

What is proposed?



Long term: Study a **full intersection redesign** to better balance access for people walking, cycling, riding transit, and driving





Pacific Heights: Traffic Calming

We heard: High traffic speeds, pedestrian conflicts, and visibility challenges near CPMC Pacific Heights and Lafayette Park

What is proposed?

- Traffic calming measures to slow traffic speeds on Webster Street and Washington Street
- Evaluating the balance of commercial and passenger loading zones near the Clay/Webster intersection to reduce double parking

Anza Vista: Traffic Calming

We heard: High traffic speeds and high volume of cut-through traffic in the residential area of Anza Vista

What is proposed?

 Traffic calming measures to slow traffic speeds on Anzavista Avenue, Barcelona Avenue, Encanto Avenue, Fortuna Avenue, Terra Vista Avenue, and O'Farrell Street








Anza Vista: Pedestrian and Cyclist Safety

We heard: Pedestrian and cyclist visibility challenges and cyclist wayfinding challenges near the Masonic/Geary intersection **What is proposed?**







Presidio Heights: Secure Bike Parking

We heard: Desire for an improved bike network and more secure bike parking in the neighborhood

What is proposed?

 Identifying locations for short-term and long-term secure bike parking to reduce concerns about bike theft

Cathedral Hill: Pedestrian Safety


We heard:

• High number of recent collisions between pedestrians and vehicles, especially involving turning vehicles

What is proposed?

 Traffic safety measures, like painted safety zones to increase pedestrian visibility and encourage drivers to turn at slower speeds





Five potential intersections:

- Post & Laguna
- Sutter & Gough
- Post & Franklin
- O'Farrell & Franklin
- Eddy & Franklin





Next Steps

- Share feedback in our survey through November 15, 2025!
- Fall 2025: Outreach, staff review and finalize recommendations, study completion
- Early 2026: Detailed design, legislation, and approvals
- Spring 2026: Construction for quick-build measures
