The San Francisco County Transportation Authority has unveiled <u>MyStreetSF</u>, the newest way to learn about transportation improvements across the city.

The online map shows projects funded by the Transportation Authority, which collects and distributes San Francisco's local half-cent sales tax for transportation, among other funding sources.

By entering an address or search term, users will find a list of nearby projects that are completed or underway. Unique features of the map allow users to browse a given area, zoom, and select project information, then download and share it easily. The site also has helpful layers to designate the city's supervisorial district boundaries, Vision Zero high-injury network, and Communities of Concern.

"From signals to streetcars and bike boulevards to curb extensions, the newMyStreetSF site allows users to track how their local taxes are helping deliver critical transportation improvements in San Francisco," said Tilly Chang, Transportation Authority Executive Director. "We hope residents and businesses will use the newMyStreetSF tool to stay engaged in local and regional transportation projects in their neighborhood and across the city."

In addition to highlighting projects funded by the half-cent sales tax, the map also shows projects the Transportation Authority funds and oversees in its role as the
